



CP2 EHO confined space entry to cable tunnel or service duct

Duration	2 Days (Experienced persons may request a 1 day refresher course)
Location	Customer site / Training Facility
Delegates	6 – 8 Students
User Type	Any person required to enter a confined space for either work or rescue operations (team leaders, risk assessors, permit issuers, plant managers). Where that person needs to have a specific knowledge of the confined space regulations 1997.
Aim	To identify the basic hazards and awareness for working in confined spaces. Also the correct procedures and inspection of equipment
Learning Objective	By the end of the course delegates will be familiar with the Water UK administrative controls for confined spaces (classification list, risk assessments, safe system of work, rescue plans, permit to work). Delegates will be able to use the various templates given to assess risks on a dynamic basis. Delegates will also be able to carry out a pre-use inspection and demonstrate the ability to correctly select and use the appropriate equipment. Delegates will also be able to judge team sizes for more complex operations should they materialize.
Method	A classroom seminar followed by practical assessment entering and leaving spaces using a variety of safety equipment and techniques.
Course Content	Classroom Introduction to course content plus Objective and aims of course Confined space legislation Classification, listing & categorisation of site specific confined spaces Use of the organisations location / task specific risk assessment Implementation of the organizations safe system of work Administrative control – permit to work documents Role of the assessor, the attendant, the entrant, the rescuer, the acceptor Development of the location specific rescue plan Practical Selection and use of entry equipment Entry into service tunnels/ducts/cable races Entry into vertical pits & manholes Selection and use of rescue equipment Communication techniques
Examination	Continuous assessment using EUSSC modules covering planning the entry, operating in the space, leaving the space, closing down and reporting, specific assessments will be made on the delegates ability to inspect and operate the equipment.
Certification	On successfully completing the training course a certificate will be issued confirming the student has completed a Confined space entry course.
Valid	3 years from date of the training course

A pre-requisite for delegates who will attend this course is the ability to participate in risk assessment workshops and be fit enough to physically enter and work in confined spaces.(It is the employers responsibility to ascertain the fitness of delegates).
